## **Review & Discuss**

Community engagement-should programming be neutral?

ALA standard of ethics says we are to stay neutral, but have collection that encompasses all aspects of an issue, both sides represented (equity of assets)

General consensus of board is to follow the ALA standards of neutrality for our programming

Indoor lighting project-retrofit existing lights with LED bulbs, requested highest wattage and lumens that could be used in existing fixtures

Oimoen- 30 or 20 Watts 3,500 lumens/light \$2,200 does not include inspection costs

Zweifel- 100 Watt 11,600 lumens/light \$3,135 including inspection costs subject to current prices of bulbs

Motion by Boyden to accept Zweifel bid with allowance for 10% increase over bid price for bulbs Seconded by Bullette Result of Vote-all in favor

Security cameras- \$14,834 for 13 proposed cameras issue is tabled until lighting project is complete
